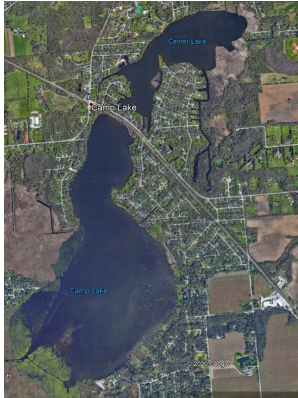
State Statutes & CCLRD Bylaws

Our by-laws require consideration & approval of last year's minutes which are attached to this newsletter. State statutes require a vote on the 2025 budget, which is also enclosed. Approval of the budget is required to remain in compliance with state law. Many projects are multi-year. You can follow our progress by reading the enclosed minutes.

Shoreline Restoration

Our cost sharing program is available for erosion control projects. Approved projects receive up to 50% cost sharing up to \$3,500. Funding is limited and project feasibility is reviewed on an individual basis; for information, email treasurer@cclrd.org.

Invasive Species

Curly-leaf pondweed can interfere with



recreational and other uses of lakes by producing dense mats at the water's surface, negatively impacting native aquatic plants and impeding navigation.

Boating Regulations

Boating on Camp Lake and Center Lake is subject to the Village of Salem Lakes ordinances and Chapter 30 of the Wisconsin State Statutes. Highlights of those regulations are posted at every launch and briefly summarized as follows:

- **Camp Lake No Wake:** Sunset to 10:00 a.m.
- **Center Lake No Wake:** Sunset to 10:00 a.m.
- No anchoring in traffic lanes
- Picnicking, swimming, camping, fires are prohibited in launch areas.
- Waterskiing and tubing counterclockwise in traffic lanes only.
- Observe no-wake buoys at all times.
- It is recommended that all boaters wear PFDs at all times.
- No boating in designated swimming areas

Public Trust Doctrine

The Public Trust Doctrine is the basis for the legal rule that all navigable waters are "common highways and forever free." The owners of land on lakes and rivers are "riparian owners" who have some rights to the waters they border, such as the right to erect and use a private pier. However, the Wisconsin Supreme Court has ruled that, in general, the public's rights to use our lakes and rivers are primary and the riparian owners' rights are secondary. These rights include access.

2025 Annual Budget

Herbicide Update

The 2024 herbicide treatment program has been successful on Camp and Center Lakes. We weed-scouted the lakes in early spring.

Curly leaf pondweed was choking the channels. This year we treated this invasive weed with Aquathol for the first time. We had many positive comments about navigation improvements.

Camp Lake's milfoil problem returned; we utilized a whole lake treatment, that was

similar to the treatment two years ago, we used Procel-laCOR.

All treatments were done with appropriate DNR permits and disbursed by licensed professionals.

2023 Harvesting Report

In 2024 our new Aquatic Plant Harvester was delivered. Just about everything on this harvester is improved vs. the old one, especially in safety and operations. Our crew members have contributed to some of the improvements Aquarius (the manufacturer) has made to their Harvester and Transport equipment. They make the equipment, but our very capable employees over the years use it and there is no better way to discover changes that can make the equipment better. Also worth noting: the DNR paid half of the cost through a grant our board (and especially Dennis) applied for last year!

Did you notice the pier in the picture above? Camp and Center Lake both received one through the Village (another grant that Dennis applied for!). Another excellent lake improvement!

Harvesting on both lakes is in full operation, this year's higher water levels have helped. The invasive species Curley-leaf Pondweed is our number one problem. Milfoil was virtually nonexistent on Center and our chemical treatment on Camp virtually wiped it out. Harvesting removes vegetation that would decay on the lake bottom, consume oxygen, and eventually turn into muck. CCLRD's two prong approach of using herbicide and mechanical harvesting has a great positive impact.



Fish stocking



In April 2024 CCLRD stocked Camp Lake with 1,844 Walleye (5-7 inch length), and over 900 Yellow Perch (4-6 inch length).

Center Lake received 480 Walleye (same length) and over 230 Yellow Perch (same length).

Generally our stocking program is done every other year. We spend approximately \$8,000 per stocking and the number of fish we can stock is regulated by the DNR Fisheries Department. The number of fish also varies depending on the cost and length of young fish available each spring. Happy fishing!

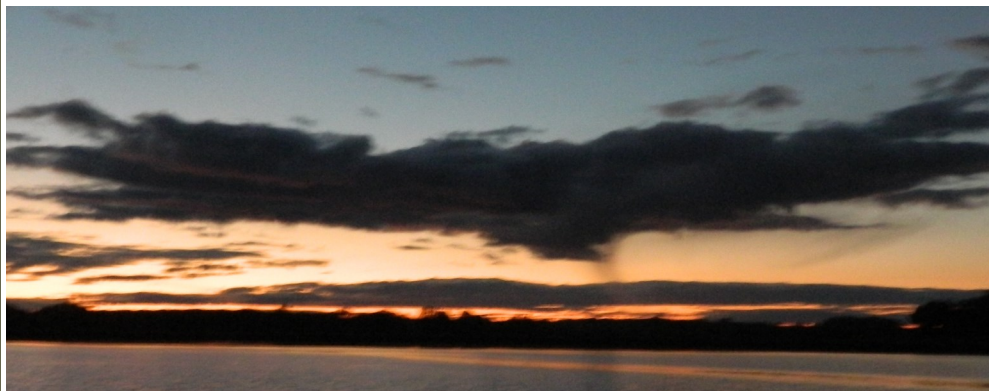


Trees sometimes fall
