To be considered for the Commissioner appointment contact Doug Hughes.

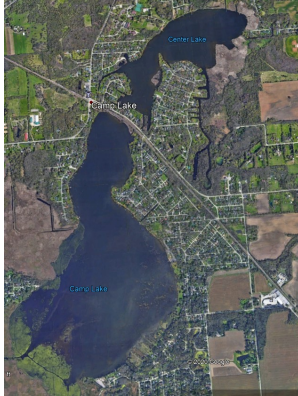
Election

Boating Regulations

Boating on Camp Lake and Center Lake is subject to the Village of Salem Lakes ordinances and Chapter 30 of the Wisconsin State Statutes.

Highlights of those regulations are posted at every launch and briefly summarized as follows:

- **Camp Lake No Wake:**
Sunset to 10:00 a.m.
- **Center Lake No Wake:**
Sunset to 10:00 a.m.
- Avoid power launching.
- Picnicking, swimming, camping, fires are prohibited in launch areas.
- Waterskiing and tubing counterclockwise in traffic lanes only.
- Observe no-wake buoys at all times.
- It is recommended that all boaters wear PFDs at all times.
- No boating in designated swimming areas

Public Trust Doctrine

The Public Trust Doctrine is the basis for the legal rule that all navigable waters are "common highways and forever free." The owners of land on lakes and rivers are "riparian owners" who have some rights to the waters they border, such as the right to erect and use a private pier. However, the Wisconsin Supreme Court has ruled that, in general, the public's rights to use our lakes and rivers are primary and the riparian owners' rights are secondary. These rights include access.

Herbicide Update

The 2020 herbicide treatment program was successful on Camp and Center Lakes.

We weed-scouted the lakes in early April and discovered Center Lake was infested with Eurasian Water Milfoil (EWM) and Camp Lake only had EWM in the southern half for a variety of possible reasons.

The lakes were professionally treated on May 27th utilizing 2, 4-D.

Approximately 40.71 acres were treated on Camp Lake and 30.49 acres were treated on Center Lake.

It has since been reported there is virtually no EWM on Camp Lake and minimal quantities on Center Lake.

2020 Harvesting Report

Once again at the start of our 2020 harvesting season we had high water conditions resulting in both Camp and Center Lakes under Slow No Wake restrictions. Along with this, the weather conditions were excellent for vegetation growth which was noted when the buoys were put into the lakes. Eurasian Water Milfoil, Widgeon Grass, Common Waterweed, Curley Leaf Pondweeds and Wild Celery were the species most noted. Harvesting started on June 8th in areas approved by the DNR prior to fish completing their near shore spawning.

After herbicide treatment, EWM loads turned out to be minimal based on harvesting loads and species identification tallies. On Center Lake in particular, the area that has a history of thick EWM growth in the north east corner of the lake was virtually void of EWM after treatment this year.

After the fish spawning about June 18th limited harvesting in those areas showed that the herbicide treatment has been very effective on the EWM. One benefit of high water is that our harvesters can get into channels that are generally too shallow in normal water conditions however, as usual at this time of the year these channels do not have a high population of weed growth. What they do have is a "Duck Weed" bloom which the harvesters can not pick up because "Duck Weed" is a very tiny aquatic flowering plant that floats in large quantities on still water, and falls through the conveyor mesh.

In summary, it appears 2020 harvesting loads and species harvested will be similar to the last few years.

Blue Green Algae

This spring several citizens noticed above-average blue green algae blooms, and wondered if there could be a health risk. CCLRD had a sample professionally tested; it came back negative for toxins. It should be noted, however, that the organisms CAN produce toxins, and the DNR does not allow treatment. It is prudent for lake users to observe several safety precautions:

- ◆ Do not swim in water that looks like "pea soup", green or blue paint, or that has a scum layer or puffy blobs floating on the surface.
- ◆ Do not let children play with scum layers.
- ◆ Always take a shower after coming into contact with any surface water.
- ◆ Avoid swallowing untreated surface water – it may contain pathogens which could make you ill.
- ◆ Do not let pets swim in, or drink, water having blue-green algae blooms or noticeably green water.
- ◆ Pets should be washed off immediately after swimming.

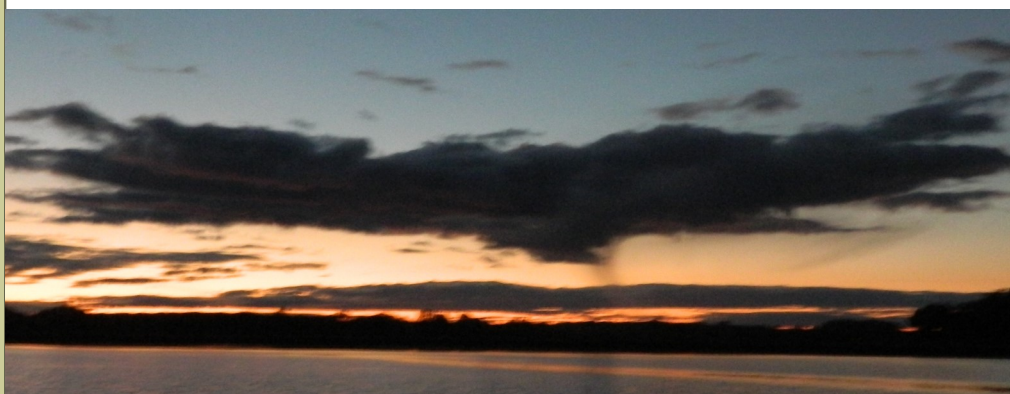
